ACADEMIC PROGRAMME

ACADEMIC COURSES

INDUCTION

On arrival all students receive an induction programme presented by the key staff who give students helpful information about the course and their stay in the UK.

ASSESSMENT

On Monday morning all students are assessed in Grammar, Listening, Writing and Speaking. They will also choose their afternoon option course for the week.

GENERAL ENGLISH

09:00-12:30 (plus Study Trip)

This course provides 12 hours of English language teaching for all students on four mornings per week plus a full-day study visit and class project on Wednesdays. Maximum class size 14. Classes cater for levels from Elementary to Advanced. There are three age divisions: 9-12 years, 13-14 years, and 15-16 years.

STUDY VISITS

Study visits are to the famous sites, castles, markets, cathedrals and museums etc. in London, Cambridge and many other destinations of educational interest to young people. Each class will have a guided tour of the sites and will complete an English language project related to the visit.

HISTORY TOURS

Each class follows a short project on the interesting history of the College including a guided tour taking in the museum, the Chapel (designed by Pugin) and other areas of historical interest.

ENGLISH EXAMINATIONS

Examination fees are included at no extra charge. City & Guilds ESOL Qualifications are available at six different levels of English. Examinations are held at the end of weeks 3 and 6. Students may prepare for them during the Examination Preparation option. Certificates are posted to successful candidates. For students of 13 years and over only.

ENGLISH THROUGH OTHER SUBJECTS

13:30-15:30 four sessions per week

This course provides 8 hours of teaching English through a subject of the student's choice. These courses are presented by specialists and qualified teachers. Class size varies according to subject with a maximum student to teacher ratio of 14:1. Courses are chosen on a weekly basis. Details of courses overleaf.

ENGLISH THROUGH OTHER SUBJECTS

ETOS Afternoon Teaching Programme

13:30-15:30 Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday

ART AND CRAFT WORKSHOP 16 places

This workshop introduces you to a range of techniques such as batik, textile dying, engraving, printing and design in our new art studio.

CERAMICS AND POTTERY 14 places

This workshop provides an introduction to ceramic techniques working with a local artist in our pottery studio. Most work can be taken home.

COOKERY 18 places

Make food from our favourite recipes learning techniques of cake and sweet making, dough and pastry making, ready to eat at 15:30!

CULTURE CLUB 14 places

Learn about the culture, history, geography and language from a native speaker teacher, Chinese, Spanish and others.

DANCE 14 places

Both boys and girls are welcome to learn the steps and moves of modern dance to the latest music and to take part in a choreographed performance.

DRAMA THEATRE AND FILM 12 places

Transform yourself and your personality through the magic of the stage! See yourself on video. Try stage make up and costume, take a fresh look at plays and the theatre.

EXAMINATION PREPARATION 30 places

This course offers preparation for City & Guilds ESOL Qualifications at six different levels. Maximum class size 10.

HORSE RIDING 10 places

An introduction to all aspects of horse welfare and stable management. The course includes sessions at the equestrian centre and riding lessons.

INTENSIVE ENGLISH Max class size 10

Work on an area of your choice in Speaking Listening, Reading, Writing or Grammar. Special needs can be catered for.

LOCAL HISTORY TRAIL 16 places

Students visit local towns and villages and follow interesting trails of discovery.

MUSIC 20 places

Students come together to learn, sing and play popular music. Students are encouraged to write their own music. Students may want to bring their own instruments.

ORIENTEERING 14 places

Use maps and compass to find your way around the course with a qualified instructor.

PAINTING AND DRAWING 14 places

A confidence building course. Learn how to draw and paint and discover your hidden talents! Visits to galleries are often included.

PHOTOGRAPHY 8 places

Learn how to take better photos, develop and print black and white photographs with a qualified photographer. Students may want to bring their own camera.

SHAKESPEARE 14 places

A great introduction to Shakespeare and his plays. Here is an opportunity to act out some of the famous scenes and see a live Shakespearean production at the theatre.

SPORTS STUDIES 42 places

A qualified coach teaches all about the game, the techniques, the history, the players, the athletes, the rules, the refereeing and of course practical coaching in Tennis, Football & Swimming.

THE MAGAZINE 12 places

Students produce the weekly magazine in the Information Technology Suite. A great opportunity to learn and practice your computer skills.

TRAMPOLINING 14 places

Here you follow the BAGA award system at your own level. Receive full instruction in learning the moves and routines. Stretch sportswear necessary.
