The assessment will take place in the Recital Room in the Music School. Individual audition times will be advised

The Cardinal Allen Music Scholarship is for talented musicians who intend to study music in the Sixth Form. It is decided by audition, interview and a written task and includes the provision of free tuition in up to two instruments at the College. Scholars will be required to offer two instruments (voice counts as one instrument). For entry at 16+ students must have a high pass at grade 6 (distinction), or Grade 7/8 in one instrument and a minimum of Grade 5 in the second instrument. Grade 5 Theory is also desirable.

A condition of the Award is that all music lessons will take place in the College or in exceptional circumstances, outside of school (if, for example a pupil attends a Junior Conservatoire).

Candidates who are successful in the scholarship offered will not only receive the financial benefit, but have the opportunity to develop their music skills fully in a growing and exciting Music Department. Students will take part in ensembles, recitals and concerts throughout the year and progress through the Associated Board or Trinity grade system. Award holders will be expected to widen their music experience and skills through the choral opportunities, as well as the curricular and co-curricular provision offered. Indeed, not only will these opportunities be available to them, but they will be expected to take a full and active part as ambassadors of the Music Department.

The College will award scholarships to successful applicants who exhibit a very good standard of musical attainment, in addition to qualities of musicianship (solo and ensemble), and demonstrate potential, commitment and personality. The auditions will involve various activities. The candidate should prepare a short recital programme of two or three pieces which will show their abilities of musicianship and technique on their first instrument/voice, and they should prepare one piece on their second instrument/voice. The type of instrument being offered and the applicant's potential will be taken into consideration. There will be an interview and short tests in sight-reading, aural and theory. Students will sit a written music examination lasting 30 minutes. The examination will test general musical knowledge and listening ability.

The Cardinal Allen Music Scholarship auditions are held in the Music School Recital room. The practice rooms in the Music School can be used to warm up. Please bring all your music and piano accompaniments. In addition to your instrumental work, if you have some singing experience, it would be helpful if you would bring a prepared song of your choice.

If you require an accompanist, please send copies of the piano scores with your application. Alternatively, you are welcome to provide your own accompanist on the day and please advise the Music School on your application.
